

Speaking Glory

Doxology, now that is a word you don't hear that often. A doxology is a theological word for a hymn or a formula of praise to God. The word doxology comes from the Greek and is broken down like this; *doxa* = glory and *logos* = word or speaking. Doxology can mean "speaking glory" or "word of glory".

Here are a couple of Biblical examples: *"To Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen"*. Ephesians 3:21. Sooo! Here is my shot at a doxology: *"Glory, honor, and praise to you most high. There is no one or nothing that compares to you. You're wonderful and I long to be in the beauty of your holiness. There are no barriers that can hinder your strength and love. You are the strong tower that stands forever. Amen."*

This week when you are busily going about your days, I encourage you at some point to burst out in praise and worship to the Lord. You will be amazed at how liberated and excited you will feel by speaking glory.
